

OFFICIAL NOTICES

At the meeting of the Board of Directors held November 17, 1938, By-Law 24 was changed by unanimous vote to read as follows:

"The annual dues shall be \$3.00. The fiscal year shall be from November 1 to the following October 31, inclusive. From November 1 to December 31 shall be a period of grace during which time full membership privileges will be allowed to the previous year's members. Members not paying their dues by January 1 shall automatically lose their membership."

The change in the fiscal year has necessitated an adjustment in the dues paid by 1938 members; therefore, a 1938 member may renew his membership in the Club for the year 1938-39 by the payment of \$2.50 rather than \$3.00. Dues are now delinquent but under By-Law 24 as amended a period of grace is allowed until December 31 within which to make payment of dues. As a further concession to members in view of the change, the Board has extended this period of grace to and including January 31, 1939. However, this extension is granted for this year, only.

Dues may be paid to any Board member or at Club Headquarters.

General Club Rules and Regulations were revised by the Board of Directors in 1937 and Lodge Rules were formulated for the current year and announced at the meeting held in the Tribune Auditorium November 18, 1938. For your review, these are printed again as follows:

CLUB RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All persons will endeavor to promote the lofty purposes of the Wasatch Mountain Club, observe the Golden Rule, and at all times respect the rights of private citizens in person and property.
- 2. The Wasatch Mountain Club will not be responsible for accidents or loss of personal belongings.
 - 3. No person shall be permitted to carry or use fire arms.
- 4. All persons will refrain from the needless destruction of plant or animal life.
- 5. The trip leader is in full charge and all persons will be governed by his decisions.
- 6. No persons shall be allowed to attend any trip if, in the opinion of the leader, they are not qualified and adequately equipped to complete the trip successfully.
- 7. No person shall leave the trail or camp except by permission of the leader.
- 8. All persons will follow the camp detail outlined by the leader and will remain quiet after he announces "lights out".
- 9. Obnoxious indulgence in alcoholic beverages will not be tolerated on or in connection with Club functions.
- 10. Guests and visitors shall be subject to all Club rules and regulations and must be sponsored by an attending member who will be held responsible for them.
- 11. Visitors to Salt Lake City and members of other mountain clubs will be extended full membership privileges.

LODGE RULES

- 1. Keys to Lodge available to members only.
- 2. Members may get Lodge keys from either Lodge Director or President. (Mr. Shaw will relinguish Lodge keys only upon presentation of a written request signed by Lodge Director or President.)
- 3. Minimum Lodge fees:
 - (a) Winter trips to Lodge:
 (b) Summer trips to Lodge:
 (1) Over night \$1.50
 (1) Over night \$1.00
 (2) Day only .75
 (2) Day only .50
 (Fire in fireplace \$1.00 extra per day.)
- 4. Regular Lodge fees:

(a) Members:

(1) Over night, winter, 35d per person. (2) Over night, summer, 25d per person.

(b) Non-members:

- (1) Overnight, winter, 50¢ per person.(2) Overnight, summer, 35¢ per person.
- 5. On private party trips to Lodge, non-members allowed only by acknowledgment of three Directors and only while a member is staying at Lodge.
- 6. Minimum of three persons permitted in Lodge (exception of married members.)
- 7. Member obtaining key will be considered in full charge and will assume responsibility at the Lodge for:

(a) Collecting from all persons using Lodge, whether in his

party or in other parties.

(b) Accounting for Club food, coal and wood used (price list for food inside cupboard door.)

(c) Damage to Club property.
(d) Proper cleanup of Lodge:

- (1) Dishes washed. (3) Cupboards closed. (2) Windows locked. (4) Floors swept.
- (5) Sink trap drained.
 (e) General observance of Lodge rules. (Scheduled trip to take precedence over any group.)
- 8. Failure to promptly return key and make settlement for use of Lodge and for food subject to penalty.
- 9. Ashes must be removed from fireplace and kitchen range before starting fires.
- 10. Positively no smoking in dormitories.
- 11. No alterations, displacements or removal of Club property without sanction of Lodge Director.
- 12, Persons defacing Club property will be penalized.
- 13. All special bulletins posted in Lodge must be ovserved.
- 14. Quiet must prevail throughout Lodge from time one in charge determines time for retirement until first call for breakfast.

Plans for a Winter membership campaign were announced by Bill Kamp, Membership Director, at the meeting held November 18. Briefly, it will be as follows:

- 1. Campaign to start December 1, 1938 and end January 31, 1939. It will be concluded with a Victory Dinner as soon as possible after drive closes.
 - 2. The following awards will be given to winners:

W. M. C. ski pin - for 150 points (this must include three new members.)

W. M. C. ski pin and Club emblem - for 150 points (this must include four new members.)

Individual with highest number of points will receive a special prize and will be guest of honor at dinner.

3. Points will be awarded on following basis:

5 points - for attending regular ski trip. *10 points - for bringing out eligible visitor on trip.

**25 points - for signing up a new member.

20 points - for being on winning team.

** Definition of "new" member: Any person who did not

belong to Club during year 1938. Definition of "eligible" visitor: Any person over eighteen years of age.

General Information: Captains of teams and their assistants will be responsible for keeping record of points scored by their teams. Members should notify their team captain when they turn in application for new member. Bulletins on team standings will be posted at 224 South State and at 30 West Broadway. Names of the teams will change with their standing: "TEMPOTURNERS", being highest; "STEMTURNERS", second; "SNOWPLOWERS", third; and "SITZ-MARKERS", the lowest. New members will be added to teams as they join the Club.
