PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION

THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION ARE SUGGESTED BY A SPECIAL COMMITTEE, HEADED BY STAN MURDOCK, FOR CONSIDERATION AT THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP AND ELECTION MEETING TO BE HELD APRIL 23RD.

AMENDMENT TWO

SECTION 18. THERE SHALL BE A WRITTEN AND PICTORIAL HISTORY OF THE CLUB MAINTAINED, GIVING RECOGNITION FOR OUTSTANDING SERVICE OF INDIVIDUALS OR GROUPS OF INDIVIDUALS TO THE CLUB. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL COMPILE BOTH WRITTEN AND PICTORIAL HISTORY AND SHALL PRESENT IT TO EACH ANNUAL MEETING, SAID HISTORY.

AMENDMENT THREE

SECTION 19. HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE BESTOWED AUTOMATICALLY TO CLUB MEMBERS WHOSE FULL MEMBERSHIP DUES HAVE BEEN
PAID FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 25 YEARS. SUCH MEMBERS SHALL
BE AWARDED ESPECIALLY DESIGNATED MEMBERSHIP CARDS AND PROPERLY
NOTED ON ALL MEMBERSHIP LISTS.

THE WASATCH MOUNTAIN CLUB HAS ALWAYS BEEN INTERESTED IN WILD LIFE AND THE COLCEPVATION OF FORESTS AND PUBLIC DOMAINS. AS A RESULT, THE DILL TO BE BROUGHT BEFORE THE HOUSE OF RESPRESENTATIVES, IN THE NEAR FUTURE IS VITAL TO ALL OF US.

THIS BILL IS TO DETERMINE WHETHER GRAZING WOULD BE GOVERNED BY LAW OR REGULATION. AT PRESENT THE STOCK MEN ON FOREST SERVICE LAND HAVE A PRIVILEGE OF GRAZING AND THE REGULATION OF THE NUMBER OF SHEEP, CATTLE, AND THE NUMBER OF WILD ANIMALS ALLOWED IN A PARTICULAR AREA IS GOVERNED BY THE FOREST SERVICE. GRAZING ON PUBLIC LANDS IS GOVERNED BY LAW, UNDER THE TAYLOR GRAZING ACT, UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT.

THOSE OF US WHO HAVE SEEN THE OVER-GRAZED CONDITIONS IN OUR MOUNTAINS, BY EITHER SHEEP OR WILD ANIMALS SHOULD BE CONCERNED AND INTERESTED IN THE INFORMATION TO BE GIVEN US BY A SPEAKER FROM THE FOREST SERVICE AND BY HUGH M. BRYAN, RANGE CONSERVATIONIST FROM THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT.

THE WEST IS THE ONLY PLACE IN THE UNITED STATES WHERE THERE ARE STILL PUBLIC LANDS. THEY ARE YOUR LANDS. COME AND BRING YOUR FRIENDS, SO THAT YOU MAY LEARN FIRST-HAND CONCERNING THIS IMPORTANT QUESTION. IT PROMISES TO BE AN INSTRUCTIVE AND INTERESTING EVENING.
