AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

TWO OF THE THREE AMENDMENTS VOTED ON AT THE ELECTION MEETING WERE PASSED. THE AMENDMENT OR REVISION OF SECTION 9, WHEREBY THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP WOULD ELECT THE PRESIDENT, VICE PRESIDENT, SECRETARY, AND TREASURER WAS NOT PASSED AND SO THE CHOICE OF THESE OFFICERS IS STILL UP TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. THOSE TO BE ADDED TO THE CONSTITUTION ARE:

AMENDMENT TWO

SECTION 18. THERE SHALL BE A WRITTEN AND PICTORIAL HISTORY OF THE CLUB MAINTAINED, GIVING RECOGNITION FOR OUTSTANDING SERVICE OF INDIVIDUALS OR GROUPS OF INDIVIDUALS TO THE CLUB. THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES SHALL COMPILE BOTH WRITTEN AND PICTORIAL HISTORY AND SHALL PRESENT IT TO EACH ANNUAL MEETING.

AMENDMENT THREE

SECTION 19. HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP SHALL BE BESTOWED AUTOMATICALLY TO CLUB MEMBERS WHOSE FULL MEMBERSHIP DUES HAVE BEEN PAID FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 25 YEARS. SUCH MEMBERS SHALL BE AWARDED ESPECIALLY DESIGNATED MEMBERSHIP CARDS AND PROPERLY NOTED ON ALL MEMBERSHIP LISTS.
