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THE LONGEST DAY IN THE YEAR

THE SUN JUST TOUCHED THE TOP-MOST PEAKS AS THE GROUP MADE ITS WAY UP THE BELL'S CANYON TRAIL TOWARD THE NORTH PEAK OF THUNDER MOUNTAIN. THE AIR WAS COOL TO THE SKIN ON THE LOWER TRAIL. THE STREAM WAS EXTRA HIGH, MAKING CROSSING DIFFICULT BUT WITH THE AID OF A ROPE STRUNG BETWEEN TWO TREES, SOME DANGLED THEIR WAY ACROSS WHILE OTHERS TRUSTED A DEAD TREE. (NO ONE FELL IN). 
FROM THE PEAK, THE CLIMBERS ENJOYED A WET SNOW RIDE INTO THUNDER BOWL FOLLOWED BY A SHORT CLIMB TO THE RIDGE AND THEN A DROP INTO HEAVY WOODS, ANOTHER SNOW RIDE AND THEN UPPER BELL'S CANYON RESERVOIR, JUST BREAKING FROM ITS BONDS OF WINTER ICE.

FROM THE RESERVOIR TO THE MEADOW WAS A SERIES OF SNOW DECENTS, WITH SOMEONE'S LEG OCCASIONALLY DROPPING OUT OF SIGHT IN THE ROTTON SNOW AROUND A LOG OR ROCK.
