## TETON VACATION TRIP BY LEADER HAROLD GOODRO

A TRIP THAT SOME OF US HAD LOOKED FORWARD TO FOR MONTHS. FIN-ALLY GOT UNDER WAY ON AUGUST 7. THE GANG OF 18 PEOPLE WERE WELL DIVIDED AMONG 5 CARS. THE RIDE UP PAST BEAR LAKE WAS BEAUTIFUL AND WAS MUCH ENJOYED UNTIL OUR CAR GOT LOST AND WE ENDED UP IN DAHO. WE FINALLY ARRIVED AT JENNY LAKE AT 3 A.M. AND AFTER DRIVING AROUND ALL THE CAMPGROUNDS, WE FINALLY FOUND A SPOT TO CAMP. AFTER CLIMBING OVER A RIDGE, UP THE MORRAINE AND ON TO THE GLACIER, WE FINALLY GOT ON TO THE BASE OF THE CLIFF AT 8 A.M. WE CLIMBED STEADILY, DRIVING OCCAS-IONAL PITONS UNTIL 3:30 P.M. WHEN WE WERE ABOUT TWO-THIRDS OF THE WAY UP, WE HAD A BITE TO EAT AND STARTED AGAIN. WE CLIMBED UNTIL DARK, THEN STARTED LOOKING FOR A PLACE TO SPEND THE NIGHT. IT WAS 9:45 P.M. WHEN WE FINALLY FOUND A SMALL LEDGE. WE DROVE IN AND PITON, LASHED OURSELF TO IT AND SPENT ONE OF THE LONGEST AND COLD-EST NIGHTS IN HISTORY. THE NEXT MORNING WE STARTED AGAIN AND FIN-ALLY REACHED THE TOP AT 10:30 A.M. WE THEN RAPELLED DOWN THE OWEN ROUTE AND MET RALPH LOWE WHO WAS ON HIS WAY UP TO FIND OUR "BODIES". THAT SAME DAY JACK BENDALL, EV WIMBER, AND CLARK TANNER HAD CLIMBED THE MIDDLE AND SOUTH TETONS FROM GARNET CANYON CAMP.

TUESDAY THE MAIN GROUP CLIMBED UP THE GRAND TO THE COONING PLACE, WHERE THEY WERE TURNED BACK BY BAD ICE AND SNOW CONDITIONS. THE TOP WAS MADE BY JACK RALPH AND MYSELF. THE WEATHER WAS BEAUTIFUL AND TOM TOOK SOME GREAT 3-D PICTURES.

AFTER RESTING WEDNESDAY, WE HEADED BACK TO JENNY LAKE. THURSDAY MORNING, RALPH UNFOLDED HIS NEW FOLDBOAT FOR OUR NEXT EXCURSION. IT ONLY TOOK ALL OF US ABOUT THREE HOURS TO PUT IT TOGETHER. RALPH AND I LOADED OUR EQUIPMENT INTO IT AND TOOK JANET AND COLLEEN ALONG TO BRING THE BOAT BACK. WE PADDLED UP STRING LAKE, THEN ACROSS LEIGH LAKE TO THE BASE OF MT. MORAN. AFTER BIDDING THE GIRLS GOODBY, WE PACKED UP THE MOUNTAIN FOR 3 HOURS AND SET UP HIGH CAMP. GETTING AN EARLY START, WE HAD A WONDERFUL 4 HOURS OF CLIMBING ON THE EAST FACE BEFORE WE REACHED THE TOP.
