#### CONSTITUTIONAL AMMENDMENT

THE FOLLOWING AMMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE WASATCH MOUNTAIN CLUB, INC., WILL BE VOTED ON AT THE ELECTION MEETING TO BE HELD APRIL 14, 1954, AT THE ART BARN, 54 FINCH LANE.

SECTION 9, OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS, AT PRESENT READS: "THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL CONSIST OF ELEVEN MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE ELECTED BY THE VOTE OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP AT THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING OF THE CLUB. AT LEAST THREE OF THOSE ELECTED SHALL HAVE SERVED ON THE PREVIOUS BOARD. THE DIRECTORS SHALL ELECT OF THEIR NUMBER THE FOLLOWING OFFICERS: A PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, SECRETARY, AND TREASURER. ANY VACANCY OCCURING IN ANY OFFICE SHALL BE FILLED BY ELECTION BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS."

THE PROPOSAL IS TO AMMEND THE FIRST SENTENCE OF SECTION 9 TO READ: "THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL CONSIST OF THIRTEEN MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE ELECTED BY THE VOTE OF THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP AT THE ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING OF THE CLUB....."

WITH THE CHANGE IN THE NUMBER ON THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, IT IS PROPOSED THAT TWO NEW BY-LAWS BE ADDED TO THE CONSTITUTION UNDER "DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND DIRECTORS" TO NAME THE FOLLOWING DIRECTORS:

MOUNTAINEERING: THE DIRECTOR OF THIS DEPARTMENT SHALL BE IN CHARGE OF MOUNTAINEERING ACTIVITIES AND INSTRUCTION AND SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL CLUB MOUNTAINEERING EQUIPMENT.

TRAILS: THE DIRECTOR OF THIS DEPARTMENT SHALL BE IN CHARGE OF MAINTENANCE OF PRESENT TRAILS IN THE WASATCH MOUNTAINS; ORGANIZE WORK TRIPS TO CLEAR TRAILS THAT ARE OVER-GROWN AND BLAZE NEW ONES; CONTACT FOREST SERVICE OFFICIALS SOLICITING FUNDS AND HELP IN CONSTRUCTION OF NEW TRAILS.

CORRECTION OF MARCH RAMBLER. THE PARRY TROPHIES CONSIST OF TWO TROPHIES TO BE PRESENTED EACH YEAR BY CLARENCE R. PARRY.

ONE, AS MENTIONED IN THE MARCH RAMBLER, IS A "MOUNTAINEERING AWARD" TO BE GIVEN TO A MEMBER EACH YEAR FOR OUTSTANDING MOUNTAINEERING ACTIVITY. THE SECOND IS AN "ACTIVITY AWARD" TO BE GIVEN IN RECOGNITION OF SERVICE TO THE CLUB. THE LATTER COVETED AWARD IS VERY WORTHWHILE IN THAT IT GIVES RECOGNITION FOR WORK DONE IN BEHALF OF THE CLUB. THERE IS AN OLD SAYING "YOU GET OUT OF A THING JUST WHAT YOU PUT INTO IT," SO THERE SHOULD BE AN INCENTIVE FOR GREATER SERVICE AND THUS MORE ENJOYMENT FROM CLUB SERVICE. WITH ITS RECOGNITION OF WORK DONE THIS YEAR, THE "MOUNTAINEERING" TROPHY IS A BEAUTIFUL BRONZE FIGURE OF AN ATHLETE WITH EXTENDED ARM, HOLDING AN OLIVE WREATH. THE FIGURE IS 5 1/2 INCHES HIGH, MOUNTED ON A 6 1/2 INCHE HIGH BEAUTIFUL POLISHED WOODEN PEDESTAL, ON THE FRONT OF WHICH IS A BRONZE ENGRAVED PLACK "W.M.C.; MOUNT-AINEERING; 1953; AND THE MEMBER'S NAME. THE "ACTIVITY AWARD" IS AN IDENTICAL ONE, EXCEPT THAT THE FIGURE IS HOLDING A TORCH.

BECAUSE NO DIFFERENTIATION WAS POSSIBLE BETWEEN TWO W.M.C. MEMBERS BECAUSE OF THEIR OUTSTANDING MOUNTAINEERING ACHIEVEMENTS, TWO "MOUNTAINEERING AWARDS" WERE PRESENTED: ONE TO HAROLD GOODRO AND THE OTHER TO JAMES SHANE. AMONG MANY ACHIEVEMENTS WAS THEIR FAMOUS AND NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED CLIMB TOGETHER LAST SUMMER OF THE NORTH FACE OF THE GRAND TETON. THE PRECEDENT SET BY THEM WILL BE A DIFFICULT GOAL TO REACH FOR IN FUTURE YEARS.

HAROLD GOODRO, AS LEADER, WISHES TO IMPRESS UPON MEMBERS ASPIRING TO GO THAT IT WILL BE A MOUNTAINEERING TRIP INTO HIGH COUNTRY, THE ELEVATION OF BASE CAMP BEING OVER 10,000 FEET. BECAUSE OF LIMITED MEANS OF TRANSPORTATION (EVERYTHING MUST BE PACKED INTO CAMP BY HORSES) IT WILL BE NECESSARY TO LIMIT PERSONAL EFFECTS TO BARE NECESSITIES AND SHELTER TO MOUNTAIN TENTS, WITH TWO PEOPLE TO A TENT. COOKING FACILITIES WILL BE LIMITED TO ONE CLUB GAS STOVE AND THE WOOD CAMP FIRE. AS IN ALL MOUNTAIN CLUB TRIPS, EVERY MEMBER WILL BE EXPECTED TO DO HIS SHARE OF MENIAL CAMP TASKS, SOME OF THE BEST COOKS HAVE TURNED OUT TO BE MEN. AS CLIMBING EXPERIENCE AND ENDURANCE UNDER ADVERSE CONDITIONS ARE NECESSARY, IT WILL BE UP TO THE LEADER TO DESIDE WHETHER OR NOT PERSONS WISHING TO GO, QUALIFY FOR SUCH A TRIP.
