LONE PEAK BY: CARL BAUER

DISREGARDING THE USUAL PROCEDURE FOR THIS CLIMB, WE STARTED FROM THE MOUTH OF BELL CANYON AT 6:30 A.M. SUNDAY. WITH CAINE ALDER AS LEADER, WE AVOIDED THE LURKING DIVERSIONS BETWEEN MEADOW AND RESERVOIR, AND FIVE HOURS LATER THE MAJORITY OF THE GROUP HAD GAINED THE SUMMIT WHERE AWAITED A PANORAMA OF SHELTERED VALLEYS AND TOWERING PEAKS FROM MT. NEBO TO BEN LOMOND.

BELOW GRANITE CRAGS WHERE THE GREAT CIRQUES FELL AWAY INTO RUGGED CANYONS, EARLY AUTUMN TINTS WERE SEEN OF ASPEN AND MAPLE, HARBINGERS OF THE GLORY WHICH WOULD BE THEIRS WITHIN A FORTNIGHT.

MUFFLED VOICES OF CATARACT AND WATERFALL BORE PLAINTIVE TESTIMONY OF RECENT ARID SEASONS, AND CREEK-CROSSING HELD LITTLE OF THE CHALLENGE OF A NORMAL WATER YEAR.
