TIGERS AND TIGRESSES OF DEVIL'S CASTLE BY MRS. JAMES "RAMSEY" SHANE

NOTE: ANOTHER PARTY OF THREE ASCENDED DEVIL'S CASTLE: CARCLYN KERCHECK, CAL GIDDINGS, AND BUD TEMPLE WENT UP THE MOUNTAIN THE EASY WAY, VIA THE USE OF ROPES UP THE FACE. IT IS UNDERSTOOD THAT NO UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCES OCCURRED, AND THAT THEY MADE THE PEAK JUST AT THE TIME THE RAIN STARTED. NEEDLESS TO SAY, THEY GOT WETTER THAN THE REST OF US.

WHEELER PEAK & LEHMAN CAVES - JULY 2 - 4, 1955 BY VERA VAN TONGEL

ON SATURDAY MORNING JULY 2, A GROUP OF EIGHT MOUNTAIN CLUBBERS STARTED FOR NEVADA TO CLIMB A 13,047 FT. MOUNTAIN. EXPECTING TO GET INTO A HOT AND DRY DESERT, WE WERE SURPRISED TO FIND IT GREEN AND FULL OF BEAUTIFUL DESERT FLOWERS. A COOL BREEZE ACCOMPANIED US ALL THE WAY. AFTER ALMOST MISSING OUR TURNOFF, WE FINALLY ENDED UP AT LEHMAN CREEK CAMPING GROUNDS (THANKS TO SHIRLEY MARTI'S ALTERNESS). AT A LITTLE PLACE CALLED BAKER, JEANNE PINAIRE CROSSED OUR WAY IN HER GREEN AUSTIN (YOU COULDN'T MISS IT!!) AND JOINED OUR PARTY.

WE SET UP CAMP AMONGST GREEN TREES, GRASS AND NEXT TO A COOL AND REFRESHING LITTLE MOUNTAIN STREAM. THEN WE WATCHED ART SCHAFER (HIS FIRST TRIP WITH THE CLUB) PITCH HIS "CASTLE", A HUGE TENT WITH - MIND YOU - A LIGHT GLOBE IN IT WHICH HE HAD HITCHED UP TO HIS CAR. WE INQUIRED ABOUT OUR TRAIL TO WHEELER PEAK AND FOUND THAT WE COULD "BUM A RIDE" IN A PICK-UP TRUCK WHICH WOULD SAVE US ABOUT TWO MILES OF HIKING. LEAVE IT UP TO THE DUDES TO DO A THING LIKE THAT!!!

PROMPTLY AT 7:00 A.M. ON SUNDAY, NINE EAGER HIKERS TOOK OFF TO CONQUER THEIR MOUNTAIN. TWO-THIRDS OF THE TRAIL LEAD US THROUGH SOME BEAUTIFUL GREEN AND COOL FORESTS, A PARADISE FOR SHUTTER BUGS. AT STELLA LAKE WE RESTED OUR WEARY BONES BEFORE STARTING UP THE ROCKY PEAK. CLARE SUNDWALL AND JACK THOMPSON DECIDED TO STAY AT THE LAKE, AND THEY SPENT THEIR TIME SUNNING AND GLISSADING DOWN THE SNOW BANKS. ART SCHAFER MADE IT TO THE FIRST RIDGE AND THEN RETURNED TO THE LAKE. IT WAS A BEAUTIFUL DAY; HOWEVER, A TERRIFICALLY STRONG AND COLD WIND REALLY GAVE THE SIX OF US A ROUGH TIME ON THE ROCKS. AROUND 12:30 WE FINALLY REACHED THE TOP WHERE WE FOUND A SHELTER TO EAT OUR LUNCH. THE VIEW WAS BREATHTAKING AND WE WERE TOLD THAT ON CLEAR DAYS YOU COULD SEE THE SMOKE OVER SALT LAKE CITY.

IT WAS SO COLD THAT GERRY CRAIG, HAVING LEFT HER JACKET BEHIND, WAS SHIVERING ALL OVER, SO WE HURRIED BACK TO THE LAKE WHERE SHE GRABBED CLARE'S BLANKET AND KEPT IT WRAPPED AROUND HER UNTIL WE REACHED A LOWER ELEVATION. A HUGE STRAW HAT WAS HER STEADY COMPANION AND JACK THOMPSON COULDN'T RESIST CALLING HER "PONCHO". JACK WAS OUR "FIRE BUG" AND KEPT US WARM BY BUILDING ENORMOUS CAMP FIRES.

ON MONDAY MORNING WE PULLED STAKES AND TOURED THE LEHMAN CAVES, WHICH ARE VERY SIMILAR TO OUR TIMP CAVES. ART SCHAFER'S CAR DEVELOPED RADIATOR TROUBLE. HOW LUCKY WE WERE TO FIND SOME BARRELS OF WATER ALONG THE HIGHWAY THROUGH THE DESERT. JEANNE PINAIRE LEFT US MONDAY MORNING, ON HER MERRY WAY TO THE NORTHWEST - WITH A DEFECTIVE FUEL PUMP.

LONE PEAK - JULY 10, 1955 BY KURT ROSENFELD

THANKS TO AN EARLY START, MOST OF THE ASCENT WAS DONE BEFORE THE SUN HAD A CHANCE TO DRY OUR THE MANY HIKERS WHO HAD COME ALONG ON THIS TRIP, ONE OF THE LONGEST IN THE WASATCH RANGE. THE STEADY PACE SET BY CAINE ALDER KEPT THE GROUP TOGETHER UP TO THE RESERVOIR, WHERE WE SPLIT INTO SMALL PARTIES ACCORDING TO THE CLIMBERS SPEED AND ABILITY. THE WAY UP TO THE PEAK OFFERED ENOUGH VARIETY IN SCENERY AND TRAILS TO KEEP EVERYONE INTERESTED, OR PANTING, TILL THE TOP WAS REACHED. A QUITE UNIQUE VIEW IS ENJOYED FROM THIS PEAK, STRETCHING FROM SALT LAKE TO MOUNT NEBO.

SNOW SLIDING AND BOULDER HOPPING MAY BE TIRESOME FOR SOME PEOPLE, BUT NOT TO ME. IT IS FROM THE RESERFOIR TO THE CARS THROUGH BELL'S CANYON THAT ALWAYS SEEMS TWICE AS LONG AS THE SAME TRAIL IN THE MORNING. THE TRAIL FROM THE LOWER MEADOW TO THE RESER-VOIR, WHICH ON PREVIOUS HIKES HAD MISLED SEVERAL PARTIES, WAS MARKED ON THE WAY UP WITH RED AND WHITE SEGNS PAINTED BY O'DELL PETERSEN AND FAMILY (MADE OVER 50 OF THEM) AND RED FLAGS BY CARL BAUER AND SHOULD BE QUETE A HELP FOR FUTURE LEADERS.

MEMBERS WHO MAY HAVE THOUGHT THAT FOUR O'CLOCK IN THE MORNING IS TOO EARLY TO START FOR LONE PEAK, FOUND OUT THAT IT WAS A GOOD THING THEY DID GET UP. THE LARGER GROUP REACHED THE CARS SHORTLY BEFORE FAVE, WHILE OTHERS WERE ON THE TRAIL UNTIL SEVEN IN THE EVENING, WHICH MADE FOR A GOOD WORKOUT FOR EVERYBODY.
