OUR SKIERS WERE JOLTED FROM THEIR SLUMBERS FOR AN EARLY START, BUT THE RATHER COMPLICATED TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM BECAME ENTANGLED IN THE "SNOW CUP" CROWD AT ALTA.
