MAP-MAKING PROJECT, OR MT. OLYMPUS, OR DO TWO PARTIAL ASCENTS GET
A SUMMIT CARD - BY DORDY WRIGHT

THE TRAIL CLIMBING SECTION ON MT. OLYMPUS MADE ITS WAY WITH NO STRAIN UNTIL THE BURNED-OFF AREA, WHEN THE TRAIL DISAPPEARED UNDER THE SNOW. WE PICKED OUR WAY UP TRYING TO AVOID THE SOFT SNOW UNTIL REACHING THE SADDLE, WHICH WAS A NICE SCENIC PALCE' FOR LUNCH. THEN COMES THE PART I FIND HARD TO EXPLAIN. NONE OF US, IT DEVELOP-ED, KNEW ANYTHING ABOUT OLYMPUS AND WE THOUGHT THE TOP WAS UP BE-HIND. SO WE STARTED OFF ROCK SCRAMBLING ALONG THE RIDGE TO THE SUMMITS EAST. REALLY DISGUSTED NOT TO GET TO THE TOP OF OLYMPUS, WE TOOK THE EASY WAY DOWN, GLISSADING, AND THEN DOWN HUGHES CANYON. CLIX HAD PRECEEDED US DOWN HUGHES WITH GRETCHEN. VIRGINIA PARMALEE, JEAN PINAIRE, AND CHUCK DUNHAM, HAVING TIRED OF THE RIDGE, WENT DOWN THE CONVENTIONAL TRAIL.
