COCK-EYED VERSION OF THE TWIN PEAKS SLIDE BY DELBERT

THIRTEEN LUCKY CLUBERS ENJOYED TEH BEST (HAD COKE BEEN THERE, IT WOULD HAVE BEEN THE "MOST FABULOUS") HIKE OF THE YEAR, SUNDAY, 3 JUNE. WE FEEL COMPASSION FOR THE REST OF YOU.

AFTER WAITING A MINUTE AND FORTY-SECONDS FOR LEADER KURT, WE STARTED LEADERLESS AT APPROXIMATELY 5:28:20 A.M., WHILE ERSATZ LEADER CAINE WAITED PATIENTLY FOR THE GANG AT KNUDSON'S CORNER, DOWN THE CANYON. THAT PROVES THAT ALMOST EVERYONE READS AUSTIN'S "RAMBLER."
