ASCENT OF THE PFE IFFERHORN - JUNE 30

A BRIGHT AND EARLY 6:30 A.M. FOUND HAROLD GOODRO, BOBBY GOODRO, CARL BAUER, JIMMY SHANE, DICK SAVILLE, GENE HIGGENBOTHAM, RONNY PETERSEN AND ANNETTE AND CAL CHRISTENSEN ASSEMBLED AT RED PINE LAKE TRAIL. READY FOR THE CLIMB. DUE TO MECHANICAL DIFFICULTIES WITH AN ALARM CLOCK-TYPE OBJECT, FIVE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE (FIRST?) GROUP ARRIVED SLIGHTLY LATER - 7:00 A.M. THIS GROUP INCLUDED JIM SHANE, ELFREDA SHANE, ELLIE LEPAGE, DENNIS McSHARRY AND CAINE ALDER. AFTER LEAVING ANNETTE AND CAL CHRISTENSEN AND BOBBY GOODRO AT RED PINE LAKE FOR FISHING, THE TWO GROUPS JOINED FORCES ON THE RIDGE AND FINISHED THE CLIMB TO ITS 11,000 FOOT SUMMIT. AFTER A HASTY LUNCH THE GROUP RE-TREATED VIA THE SLOPES ABOVE ALPINE CANYON THEN ALONG THE RIDGE AND INTO HOGUM FORK AND HAD LOADS OF FUN GLISSADING DOWN THE HUGE SNOW FIELDS. A FEW MEMBERS, HOWEVER, DECIDED IT WOULD BE MUCH MORE FUN TO TAKE THEM VIA RUMP-A-SADING. AFTER LEAVING THE SNOW, THE REST OF THE TRIP LAY THROUGH THE TANGLED BRUSH OF HOGUM FORK (AND NO MACHETE.) THIS PROVED TO BE DEE-LIGHTFUL TO THE MEMBERS WEARING SHORTS. AS A GRAND FINALE THERE WAS A TREACHEROUS CROSSING OVER LITTLE COTTONWOOD THAT TOOK ALL THE ENGINEERING SKILL THE GROUP HAD TO OFFER. THE TRIP OFFICIALLY ENDED AT SMITH'S, WHERE BRUISES, CUTS AND DIRT WERE QUICKLY DROWNED IN COOL REFRESHMENTS.

"A BIT OF ROCK SCRAMBLING AT THE TOP" WAS A BIT OF UNDERSTATEMENT IN THE OPINION OF TWO OF THE PARTY WHO SCALED DEVIL'S CASTLE ON JULY 14.

THOSE TWO INNOCENTS, ALONG WITH 17 OTHERS, LEFT JUNIOR AND MAXINE Bounous' House above ALTA ABOUT 8:45 AND DROVE VARYING DISTANCES UP THROUGH THE ALPINE MEADOWS, SOME CAUTIOUSLY PARKING AT THE FIRST SIGN OF SNOW OR MOISTURE ON THE ROAD AND OTHERS, BRAVER OR WITH MORE ABLE VEHICLES. DRIVING ALMOST UP TO SECRET LAKE. SOME OF THE CAUTIOUS THREW CAUTION TO THE WINDS AND RODE ON THE TAILGATE OF JIM'S STATION WAGON.

JEWEL-LIKE LITTLE SECRET LAKE WAS STILL FLOATING A LARGE RAFT OF

SNOW NEAR THE SOUTHEAST SIDE. EVERYONE SAT DOWN THERE TO WAIT FOR THOSE WHO WALKED THE LAST STRETCH OF ROAD. THEN THE GROUP SEPARATED INTO THREE PARTIES, ONE LED BY HAROLD GOODRO ON THE LONG CLIMB AROUND BALDY AND UP AMERICAN FORK TWIN, A LARGER PARTY LED TO THE SUMMIT OR DEVIL'S CASTLE BY JIM SHANE, AND A SMALLER PARTY WHICH STAYED AT SECRET LAKE TO SUNBATHE AND RELAX.

THE ASCENT UP TO THE RIDGE WAS JUST STRENUOUS ENOUGH TO BE CONSIDERED INVIGORATING EVEN BY THE WEAKEST.

THERE WAS A "BIT OF ROCK SCRAMBLING" ALONG THE RIDGE WITH TIME OUT OCCASIONALLY TO LOOK DOWN ON EITHER SIDE. ALBION BASIN WITH ITS SUMMER HOMES AND ITS NUMEROUS WINDING MOUNTAIN ROADS, ONE ENDING NEAR SECRET LAKE, LAY FAR BELOW TO OUT LEFT; WHILE STEEPLY BELOW ON THE RIGHT PITTSBURG LAKE WAS VISIBLE.

THE ROCK SCRAMBLING SUDDENLY TURNED TO SERIOUS CLIMBING. THE EXPOSURES WERE SUCH THAT, CONSIDERING THE CLIMBING TECHNIQUE OF A COUPLE OF THE MEMBERS, JIM DEEMED IT WISE TO BRING HIS ROPE INTO USE. BY MEANS OF IT AND MUCH WHEEDLING AND CGAXING, HE GOT THE NOVICES TO THE TOP OF THE FIRST SUMMIT WHILE THE EXPERIENCED PUSHED QUICKLY ON TO THE SECOND SUMMIT.

Coming down was without incident. Two quite steep snowfields offered an invitation to glissade, and Junior responded with a beautiful and spectacular performance. Jim⁵s skill showed off well, too, and Maxine displayed a remarkable aptitude for a snow sport which was apparently new to her. The rest of us got down, also.

After the climbers were reunited with the sunbathers, everyone started down the trail in Jim's station wagon. Part of the way down there was a short delay to dislodge a car from a mudhole in the side of the road and another delay to change a flat.
