DURING THE NIGHT, , WHILE ON A TRAMP TO THE CASTLE, DECIDED THAT A HEADLONG DIVE IN THE FRESH SNOW IN HIS PAJAMAS WOULD BE GREAT FUN. I GUESS HE WANTED PRACTICE FOR THE FOLLOWING DAY.
