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THIS MONTH'S PERSONALITY BY CAINE ALDER

MY SECOND, AND VERY NEARLY MY LAST CLIMB WITH THE WASATCH MOUNTAIN CLUB WAS TO THE SUMMIT OF LONE PEAK. THIS WAS ON JULY 13, 1952, THE DAY THAT I FIRST MET HAROLD GOODRO.

I USUALLY HAVE SOME FAITH IN MY FIRST IMPRESSIONS BUT, AS WITH JIM SHANE, MY FIRST IMPRESSION OF HAROLD HAD TO BE RADICALLY CHANGED AS MY ACQUAINTANCE WITH HIM PROGRESSED. THE IMPRESSION: "WHO IN THE WORLD IS THIS OLD FELLOW? I HOPE THAT I DON'T END UP HAVING TO PLAY NURSEMAID TO HIM."

Since Joining the Club in 1941, Harold's activities have been many and varied. He has numerous achievements to his credit.

SKIING: HAROLD WAS A RACER FOR EIGHT YEARS. INTERMOUNTAIN CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMP IN 1943-44. Tood 5th place in the Snow Cup in 1944. HAS BEEN HEAD OF ALTA SKI PATROL FOR THE LAST TEN YEARS. ON SKIS HAS CLIMBED, AMONG OTHERS, LONE PEAK AND TWIN PEAKS.

ROCK CLIMBING: HAROLD WAS THE FIRST MAN TO CLIMB #13 AT PETE'S ROCK. LAST SPRING, IN COMPANY WITH TWO OTHER MEN, HAROLD CLIMBED THE FORMIDABLE SHIPROCK. WITH JIM SHANE HE CLIMBED THE NORTH FACE OF THE GRAND TETON IN 1953.

MOUNTAIN CLIMBING: WITH JIM SAHNE, HAROLD MADE A RECORD OF 1 HR. 40 MIN. UP TWIN PEAKS VIA STAIRS GULCH. NO ONE TO MY KNOWLEDGE, SAVE PERHAPS PETZOLDT, HAS DONE AS MUCH CLIMBING IN THE WIND RIVER RANGE AS HAROLD. HE HAS MADE, FOR EXAMPLE, NINE ASCENTS OF GANNETT PEAK. HE HAS CLIMBED NINE OF THE 13 TETON PEAKS, THE GRAND BY 4 DIFFERENT ROUTES.

HAROLD WITH TWO OTHERS WAS THE FIRST TO REACH THE BOTTOM OF NEFF'S CAVE WHICH IS CONSIDERED THE THIRD MOST DANGEROUS CAVE TO DESCEND IN THE UNITED STATES.

IT WAS INEVITABLE THAT A MAN WITH THESE ACCOMPLISHMENTS SHOULD BE ELECTED PRESIDENT OF THE WASATCH MOUNTAIN CLUB. AND THAT HE HAS. IN FACT THIS IS HIS 4TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR. THAT IS A RECORD IN ITSELF.

Space does not permit me to elaborate further upon Harold's mountain climbing activities.

I SHOULD LIKE TO SAY BEFORE CLOSING THAT HAROLD HAS A WONDERFUL ABILITY TO GET ALONG WITH AND TO LEAD YOUNG MEN. THIS, NO DOUBT, WAS ONE OF THE REASONS THAT HE WAS SELECTED OUTSTANDING SOLDIER OF THE UTAH NATIONAL CAMP FOR 1954. AND ALSO ONE OF THE REASONS WHY, AS A LEADER, HE RECEIVES SUCH RESPECT ON ANY CLIMBING VENTURE HE UNDERTAKES.

LAST, BUT NOT LEAST, I SHOULD LIKE TO SAY THAT MOST OR ALL OF THE ABOVE MIGHT NOT HAVE HAPPENED HAD IT NOT BEEN FOR HAROLD'S WONDERFUL WIFE, HELEN, WHO, BESIDES LOOKING AFTER HER FOUR CHILDREN, IS FINISHING COLLEGE THIS QUARTER.
