GENERAL MEETING

NOVEMBER 12

A GOOD GROUP ASSEMBLED TO DISCUSS THE WEATHER AND WHEN, IF EVER, WOULD THERE BE ANY SNOW, AND OTHER ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST. AFTER THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER, SEVERAL ITEMS OF GENERAL INTEREST WERE DISCUSSED. THE TWO THAT TOOK MOST OF THE TIME ARE DESCRIBED IN THE NEXT TWO SECTIONS OF THIS RAMBLER. OTHER SUBJECTS DISCUSSED WERE HOW TO GET MORE NEW MEMBERS AND THE HEARINGS ON THAT DAY ON THE WILDRENESS BILL BEFORE THE U. S. SENATE INTERIOR COMMITTEE IN THE SALT LAKE CITY FEDERAL BUILDING.

FOOD - CHILI OR SOMETHING OF THE SORT - WILL BE SERVED, MIX WILL BE AVAILABLE, ALL FOR A CHARGE OF 25¢ (BYOL.)

THE HOURS - 6:30 TO 9:30 P.M. MEMBERS MAY BRING A GUEST OR TWO, BUT PLEASE, NOT ALL THE ALTA SKIERS. AS A REMINDER, A NOTICE WILL BE POSTED ON A SIGN IN THE ALTA AREA, BUT IT WILL NOT GIVE THE ADDRESS, SO READ YOUR RAMBLER.

CHILDREN!

A SITUATION NEW TO THE CLUB HAS ARISEN OVER THE LAST YEAR OR TWO, NAMELY, THAT SO MANY OF OUR MOST ACTIVE MEMBERS ARE COUPLES WITH CHILDREN THAT AT TIMES OTHER MEMBERS OAVE WONDERED IF THE LODGE HAD NOT BECOME A NURSERY. WE CERTAINLY DO NOT WANT TO TELL OUR MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN IN REGULAR ATTENDANCE ON WORK TRIPS, THAT THEY CAN'T COME TO THE LODGE WITH CHILDREN; AT THE PRESENT PRICE OF BABY SITTERS THEY'D RESIGN! STILL, WE NEED ALSO CONSIDER THE FEELINGS OF THOSE WHO

BELIEVED THAT IN JOINING THE WMC THEY WOULD HAVE THE COMPANY OF ADULTS IN ADULT ACTIVITIES.

HIS MATTER WAS DISCUSSED IN BOARD MEETING, AND AT THE GENERAL MEETING NOVEMBER 12. ALL (BOTH THOSE WITH AND WITHOUT CHILDREN) SEEMED TO AGREE THAT A COMPROMISE WAS NECESSARY, WITH DEFINITE RULES SO THAT ANYONE WHO GOES TO THE LODGE WILL KNOW WHAT TO EXPECT.

THE RULES OFFICIALLY ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS ON NOV. 19, 1958, ARE:

1. CHILDREN ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE LODGE ON THE EVENING OF, OR OVERNIGHT ON, A REGULARLY SCHEDULED CLUB FUNCTION UNLESS PERMISSION IS EXPRESSLY GIVEN IN THE ANNOUNCEMENT FOR THAT FUNCTION.
2. CHILDREN ARE ALLOWED DURING THE DAY AND FOR DINNER AT ALL REGULARLY SCHEDULED CLUB LODGE FUNCTIONS, UNLESS THEIR ATTENDANCE IS EXPRESSLY PROHIBITED IN THE ANNOUNCEMENT FOR THAT FUNCTION.
3. CHILDREN ARE NOT TO BE TAKEN ON SCHEDULED CLUB TRIPS. EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE MAY BE MADE BY THE LEADER ON A TRIP, BUT ONLY IF HE IS CERTAIN THAT THE CHILDREN TAKEN WILL NOT INTERFERE WITH THE PLEASURE OF MEMBERS ON THE TRIP, AND THAT THE PARENTS ARE BOTH WILLING AND ABLE TO TAKE FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR CHILDREN ON THE TRIP.
4. ON OCCASIONS NOT COVERED BY THE ABOVE, SUCH AS WHEN THE LODGE IS OPEN ON AN INFORMAL BASIS, THE BOARD (OR THE LEADER IF THE BOARD DOES NOT ACT) SHALL ANNOUNCE WHETHER OR NOT CHILDREN WILL BE PERMITTED TO ATTEND.

WE HOPE THAT UNDER THESE RULES IT WILL BE POSSIBLE TO PLEASE EVERYONE MOST OF THE TIME; MORE THAN THAT IS CLEARLY IMPOSSIBLE. FURTHER SUGGESTIONS ON THIS SUBJECT FROM THE MEMBERSHIP WILL BE APPRECIATED. THESE RULES ARE ONLY OUR FIRST ATTEMPT AND WILL BE RECONSIDERED AFTER SOME EXPERIENCE IN THEIR APPLICATION.
