JAMES SHANE BY CAINE ALDER

IN THE YEARS THAT I HAVE KNOWN JAMES SHANE (SIX) HE HAS IMPRESSED ME AS ONE OF THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO ENJOYS EVERYTHING HE DOES. THIS RANGES FROM AUTO REPAIRING TO WATER SKIING TO ROCK CLIMBING.

I FIRST MET JIM IN BROAD FORK CANYON IN THE SPRING OF 1952. MY FIRST IMPRESSION: "WHY IS THIS CHUBBY FELLOW WITH US? THIS IS NO PLACE FOR A PERSON WITH A SANTA CLAUS BUILD. HE HAS NO BUSINESS BEING UP HERE!" IN THE ENSUING MONTHS THIS FIRST IMPRESSION WAS MOST RADICALLY CHANGED.

After Leaving Chicago for Idaho Falls in 1940, Jim moved on to Salt Lake City in 1941 and, Lacking acquaintances here, started climbing solo up various mountains in the Wasatch.

JIM GAINED STATURE AS A CLIMBER WHEN, AFTER JOINING THE CLUB IN 1942, HE NONCHALANTLY CLIMBED No. 13 AT PETE'S ROCK IN PITCH DARKNESS.

IN THE WINTER OF 42-43, JIM BEGAN TO SKI. SOME PEOPLE THAT I HAVE TALKED TO STILL REMEMBER SOME OF THE TREMENDOUS EGG-BEATERS THAT JIM USED TO TAKE WHEN FIRST LEARNING TO SKI.

IN 1944 JIM JOINED THE SKI PATROL AT ALTA. A LITTLE LATER ON IN '44, HE ENLISTED IN THE AIR CORP; HE WAS RELEASED IN 1946 AND IMMEDIATELY ENROLLED AT THE UNIVERSITY OF UTAH IN THE COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING. WHILE AT SCHOOL, JIM WAS IN CHARGE OF ALL OF THE UNIVERSITY SKI INSTRUCTORS. AFTER WORKING HIS WAY THROUGH AS A MACHANIC, JIM GRADUATED IN 1950 WITH DEGREES IN M.E. AND E.E.

JIM HAS SERVED AS PRESIDENT OF THE CLUB ON TWO DIFFERENT OCCAS-IONS AND ALSO WAS COMMISSARY DIRECTOR FOR ONE YEAR.

IN 1953, JIM HAD ONE OF HIS BIGGER YEARS IN CLIMBING. IN MARCH OF THAT YEAR HE HELPED PAVE THE WAY FOR THE COMPLETE PENETRATION OF NEFF'S CAVE. IN JULY, HE DOUBLE TRAVERSED THE GRAND CANYON IN 21 HOURS, AND IN MID-AUGUST CLIMBED WITH HAROLD GOODRO THE NORTH FACE OF THE GRAND TETON, FOR WHICH THEY WERE AWARDED THE CLUB'S ANNUAL MOUNTAINEERING TROPHY.

JIM HAS BEEN DIVISIONAL CHAIRMAN OF THE NATIONAL SKI PATROL SINCE 1954. HE ALSO HAS BEEN ON THE STAFF OF THE ENGEN SKI SCHOOL AT ALTA SINCE THAT YEAR.

JIM HAS MANY HOBBIES AND INTERESTS, AMONG THEM THE FOLLOWING: AUTO REPAIRING, GOLF, TENNIS, SWIMMING, WATER SKIING, CHESS AND SO ON. IS IT ANY WONDER THAT HE IS ONE OF THE MOST POPULAR AND INTERESTING PERSONS IN THIS AREA.
