

# 3-4 OCTOBER 1959

THE GROUP OF MEMBERS THAT MADE THIS FASCINATING JAUNT, LEFT SALT LAKE CITY, FRIDAY EVENING. THE SUBURBAN SUSTAINED A FLAT TIRE EN ROUTE, BUT ARRIVED EARLY THE FOLLOWING MORNING (ABOUT 2 A.M.) AT THE FIRST BIVOUAC, THE TURNOFF TO DEAD HORSE POINT.

# NOTCH PEAK - CRYSTAL BALL CAVE OCT. 17-18

Again the success of our expedition was assured when we convinced Dave that he and his valiant suburban were coming along, but we have still to prove that our globe trotting isn't hard on tires.
