ADDITIONAL MILEAGE MAY INCLUDE MT. RAINIER (188 MILES) OR OLYMPIC PENINSULA (490 MILES.)
3. COLUMBIA RIVER - PORTLAND - COAST (600 MILES OF COASTLINE) - REDWOODS - SAN FRANCISCO (TOTAL 2570 MILES)
4. COLUMBIA RIVER - PORTLAND - COAST (480 MILES OF COASTLINE) - TRINITY RIVER - LASSEN PARK. (TOTAL 2350 MILES.)

THESE UNFORTUNATES ARE MUCH SOUGHT TARGETS FOR THE LETHAL AIR RIFLE OF YOUNG DAVY CROCKETTS, WHOSE WEAPON WOULD SERVE ITS ONLY USEFUL PURPOSE WHEN TIGHTLY WOUND AROUND THE NECK OF AN OLDER DELINQUENT,

HIS HAWK AND OWL KILLING FATHER.

OUR SUBSIDIZED CAT POPULATION, OSTENSIBLY NECESSARY TO CONTROL MICE, BASKS IN A WORLD OF "AMOUR" WHICH HOLDS NO PERILS BUT AN OCCASIONAL WELL-AIMED ALARM CLOCK, OR BEING MISTAKEN FOR A PEDESTRIAN.
