



The Gourmet Ski Tour

It's always useful to know whether the gods are smiling or frowning. They're usually smiling. What Do You Know About the Proposed I-215 Freeway?

The "Beltway" was planned approximately 20 years ago as a limited access highway around the city perimeter as a national defense route. Population shift in the Salt Lake Valley has rendered the old proposed "Beltway" obsolete. Cottonwood, Inc. was organized by residents in the Holladay-Cottonwood area to protect the integrity of a good portion of the Cottonwood area that would be severely damaged by intolerable noise, air and water pollution. In the past this group has protected zoning and limited commercial enterprises.

On April 18, 1979, attorneys for Cottonwood, Inc. filed for a preliminary injunction to enjoin the State Department of Transportation from beginning construction of the southeast quadrant. Federal Judge Bruce Jenkins has taken this request under advisement and is expected to give his ruling in the near future. Assuming that the preliminary injunction is granted, a trial will be held in the Federal court to decide the issues raised by the lawsuit.

What are the issues?

VIOLATION OF--the letter and spirit of THE NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT OF 1969.

VIOLATION OF--THE NOISE CONTROL ACT as the Project will cause noise levels in excess of Federal standards and thereby endanger the health and welfare of persons near the Project.

VIOLATION OF--THE CLEAN AIR ACT by constructing a Federally funded highway which is not consistent with an approved "State Implementation Plan."

VIOLATION OF--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ACT OF 1968 and THE NATIONAL HISTORIC PREVENTION ACT inasmuch as the Project requires the "taking" of parklands at Little Cottonwood Regional Park, including the Wheeler Farm with increased noise, air pollution and alteration of the surrounding environment.

VIOLATION OF--THE FEDERAL AID HIGHWAY ACT OF 1968 for failure to comply with the required public hearings which consider the social, economic and environmental effects.

VIOLATION OF--THE FISH AND WILDLIFE COORDINATION ACT due to lack of consultation with the Fish and Wildlife Service on diversion of the Little Cottonwood Creek into a 300-foot flume over the roadway.

VIOLATION OF--THE FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT for failure to consider the pollution from storm sewers flowing into Little Cottonwood Creek.

FAILURE TO --comply with Federal statutes requiring preparation of a supplemental or new Environmental Impact Statement required by major modifications in design (fluming of Little Cottonwood Creek, depression of profile, etc.).

These points are merely a short summary of the grounds upon which our actions rest. They are supported by previous court cases in other parts of the country. Cottonwood, Inc. and its supporters must raise sufficient funds to ensure that the above points of law are properly contested in court by our attorneys with the assistance of the necessary expert witnesses.
