WMC AVALANCHE COURSE

The annual Wasatch Mountain Club avalanche course will be held on Saturday, Jan. 9. It is open to the public for a \$3.00 donation. The course is set up primarily for x-country skiers, but downhill skiers and snowmobilers will find the information to be most valuable.

The course is in two parts. The morning session runs from 8:00 AM to noon at Zion Lutheran Church, 1070 Foothill Blvd. (rear entrance). This includes slides, movies, and lectures on such subjects as predicting and avoiding avalanche danger, safe route selection in the back country, proper actions of an avalanche victim, and rescue procedures.

After lunch, the class will reconvene in some snowy location to practice rescue techniques, with emphasis on use of electronic transceivers. No skis or snowshoes will be necessary.

ZION NARROWS OUTING

HOUNDS TOOTH IN THE FOG

After gaining a sub-ridge the ascent was straight forward except for a gale-force south wind which, at times, literally blew us over. VOLUNTEERS SOUGHT FOR RESEARCH EXPEDITIONS WORLDWIDE

Ever dreamed of going on a research expedition to the wilds of Africa, or to the depths of a tropical rainforest? Team members share the work and the costs of launching the expedition--and pay their own airfare to get to the research site. But as a volunteer, all the expenses are tax-deductible.

This year EATHWATCH is mobilizing over 75 projects, about half overseas. You can study rhesus monkey feeding behavior in Nepal, join a team of ornithologists in the Caribbean, or monitor the songs of humpback whales. You can dig into the Indian history of a Louisiana bayou, or track kangaroos across the wilds of Australia.

You don't have to be a scientist to apply. EARTHWATCH expeditions can use your talents or your hobbies: photography, carpentry, scuba-diving, crafts, or mechanical know-how. Most of all they can use your sense of adventure--and sense of humor. EARTHWATCH projects are real working experiences.

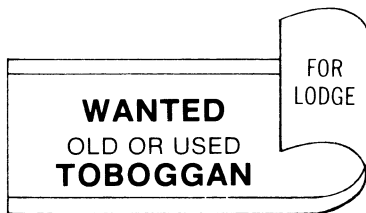
