Many thanks for your contributions! I'd particularly like to thank Jim Lee for his legal council and preparing the legally sound document from which the final form was adapted. The Club and Governing Board is most grateful.

Some of the best laid plans of mice and men, and some mediocre ones too, never see the light of day. Our 1983 Avalanche course was only slightly more successful than that. A series of 4-step publicity failures, culminated by the Rambler spending two 3-day weekends at the printers, gave us a word of mouth turnout of only 25 or 30 people. The course had some fine additions to previous years, but failed to remind hundreds of people to be careful, so . . .

BE CAREFUL!

Call the avalanche forecast center (364-1581) before you go touring or even daily to keep abreast of developments in the snow pack.

Read. Numerous books and pamphlets are available in mountain shops that help you understand the risks as well as the rewards of being in the backcountry in the winter.

Be courageous. If it doesn't look right, no matter how many tracks are already there, don't go.


Carry the appropriate gear. A beacon (peips, skadee, ramer, etc.) will <u>not</u> save lives, nor will an avalanche cord. They only help find a victim. A shovel is needed to dig somebody out. Skis are for standing on, shovels are for digging. If members of the party don't have

beacons, precaution dictates probe poles be along. The Club owns some, along with a light, backpackable emergency sled kit. They are kept by the touring director and are available for any tour on which a leader would like them. Call and they are yours.

Although they are rather expensive, you might consider poles that can be adapted as probes. How expensive are they if you really need them?

Continue to be careful and enjoy outdoors in winter. A special thanks to Norm Fish and the rest of the touring committee; Mike Hendrickson, Harry Kimbrough, Ferdy de Souza, Emily Hall and Ann McDonald for carrying on in my absence.

WASATCH MOUNTAIN CLUB LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Life Member designation is a privilege and recognition of service in the Wasatch Mountain Club. Payment of dues and participation in Club activities for the designated period of time are not in themselves sufficient for candidacy for Life Membership.

The following must be satisfied for Life Member candidacy:

- 1. Twenty-five (25) years of continuous dues paying membership in the WMC. In the case of interrupted membership, the candidate may update the dues in arrear with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- 2. The Life Member candidate must have satisfied one of the following:
 - a. Serve as a member of the Board of Directors.

Life Membership applications must be cleared by the Board of Directors and must be approved by simple majority vote of the general membership at the regular WMC General Membership Meeting.

Life Member dues will be equivalent to the existing RAMBLER subscription fees.

After approval of Life Membership it is incumbant upon that member to indicate to the WMC Membership Director her/his intention to remain on the rolls of the Club. If Life Membership is not so indicated (e.g., missed/interrupted payment of dues) the member may be reinstated into the rolls upon appropriate indication and payment of dues through the Board of Directors.
