So far we have received just over \$600 from WMC members for the Club to match donations to the Friends of the Utah Avalanche Forecast Center. We have committed \$3000 to the matching fund. Mountain Accord is stirring to life. Several UTA members who were on the Accord Executive Board are now fully gone from UTA and the Accord Board. As a result, it appears that the push on trains will be much reduced. The new director of UTA has stated that the job of UTA is to provide what the public wants and needs. So we are finally out of the grasp of the train cabal.

The land designation bill is moving again. A group of Accord folks will be in Washington in March to meet with our congressional delegation to start the process of introducing a bill. It also looks like I will be heading up the committee that is charged with coming up with trail network for the Wasatch per the Accord boundaries. This will be based on input received during the Mountain Accord process and will integrate trails with trail heads, appropriate transportation, environmental stewardship and balanced use and capacity....or something like that.

CANYONEERING 101 WITH RICK THOMPSON

HANKSVILLE, NORTH WASH, OCTOBER 22ND-OCTOBER 25TH Trip Report and Photos By Paul Kikuchi



Thursday October 22nd, Rick Thompson drove to Hanksville to reserve a campsite in preparation for the canyoneering group that would be arriving Friday. Early Friday, Jim Quan and Leisa Root met Rick at the campsite. After setting up their tents, Rick took James and Leisa to experience a slot canyon a short distance away from camp. They both loved it and were excited to experience the North Wash with the rest of the group the following day.

By late Friday night, all had arrived at our campsite. Our group was comprised of James Quan, Leisa Root, Jerry Turner, Da Yang Wipfel, Paul Kikuchi, Charlie and Rebecca Sizemore. Saturday morning we hiked to North Wash Canyon near our camp. Rick gave detailed instructions on the basics of canyoneering. Canyoneering requires teamwork, listening, learning new techniques, various styles and methods to navigate each section of the canyon.

Usually there were no aids except for our hands, elbows, feet, legs, and body friction to navigate down the crevices. Mental focus is necessary in order to concentrate on your next move, be attentive to detail, and stay calm.

This was the first "exposure" to canyoneering for most of us. Each canyon had its own unique personality and difficulty, requiring a variety of technical moves to navigate through the corridors. The slots were incredibly beautiful made from sandstone that was carved by water. Inside the ravine there are twists, turns, colorful walls that change color and unusual contours engraved by the force of nature. We discovered vast rooms with cathedral like ceilings, to slots just wide enough to wiggle through sideways holding our packs high.


Words cannot describe the beauty and splendor inside the slot canyons. Each canyon, even though in close vicinity to each other, has its own personality and variety of skills and expertise to navigate. We were in awe at the wonder of nature's force that turns sandstone into sculptures of amazing shapes.

When I arrived home and was asked, how was it? A feeble attempt was made to explain what just transpired. Only those who have been there and done that could actually understand what we just experienced.

Rick, you are an amazing master of the canyons, a teacher, guardian, and a graceful Gazelle in the slots! Thank you for sharing your love of the sport and contributing your time and effort introducing this amazing experience to others. From all of us that experienced that memorable weekend, we want to express our fullest appreciation to Rick for showing us the "ropes." Thank you so much for unforgettable memories!




BRIDAL VEIL ICE CLIMB


PROVO CANYON, DECEMBER 18TH

We'll stay at the warm and cozy Rubys Inn, just outside the park, and take advantage of the fee free 30+ km of trails, which have a ski track and snowshoe space, both inside the park, and in the adjoining national forest. Plan to drive down whenever you can get away- morning, afternoon or evening, and spend the weekend seeing and snowshoeing, or skiing the area, and returning home on Sunday. There are lots of trails, including groomed track, and loop options, so you can go to see it all and get a workout, or you can just go to see it, and kick back and take advantage of the many amenities, including the spa, hot tub and indoor pool. Half price rates @ Rubys Inn in this offseason make it an affordable getaway, on top of being a memorable weekend. You can get a nights lodgings for 42\$ on the KSL website (see below). Come down anytime: by leaving friday morning I plan on an afternoon hike on friday before dinner. If you have to work all day, come down and join us friday evening for saturday and sunday hikes. Whether you come Friday morning or evening, its a beautiful weekend you won't forget. Last year there was not enough snow to cross country ski, but some years there has been deep snow and adventureous skiing. On years when the snow wasn't even deep enough to snowshoe, we used microspike/yaktraks, as there was still ice on the steep trails in places. Bryce is over 8000 ft in elevation, come prepared for full winter Wasatch conditions; bring your camera, and also your swim suit. Get your room ASAP. the last time they ran a special on KSL it was for a limited time. While some people did get a room with the KSL deal, it is possible that the limit on the number of rooms under this arrangement has already been reached. I understand that now they are offering a winter warmer special, where you pay full price for one night and get the second night for half price, which is not a terrible deal, just not as good as the KSL offer that appears to have been basically a bait and switch. The rooms come out to 52\$ a night instead of 42\$, a difference of 5\$ a bed, if you're sharing a room. This trip has now maxed out, and is full.
